Our clinicians provide routine and emergency mental health assessments, diagnostic assessments, stabilization, crisis intervention, and treatment planning of clients in the community, in the Crisis Stabilization Unit, and on the Crisis Hotline.

QUALIFICATIONS

- Bachelor's degree in a behavioral health related field is required (Master's degree preferred)
- State of Ohio licensure (LSW, LPC, or MFT) required
- Independent licensure (LISW, LPCC, or IMFT) preferred
- Experience in the mental health field is preferred
- Experience with trauma-informed services or training is a plus

ESSENTIAL JOB FUNCTIONS

- · Conduct mental health assessments within the facility and out in the community
- Work with families, community agencies, and law enforcement to assess and intervene with clients reported to be in crisis
- Provide face-to-face counseling and de-escalation techniques to help stabilize a crisis situation
- Utilize a Trauma Informed care approach in all interactions
